

Effective July 1, 2010: Tolls Increase on Bay Area's State-Owned Bridges

Starting July 1, 2010:

The two-axle toll rate will increase from \$4 to \$5 on most of the seven state-owned toll bridges in the Bay Area;

Time-of-Day pricing will be charged during weekday peak periods at the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge;

Carpools will be charged a discounted toll rate of \$2.50 (Carpools will be charged a discounted rate of \$3 on the Golden Gate Bridge); and

Carpool vehicles will be required to have a FasTrak toll tag to receive the toll discount at any Bay Area toll bridge. At the state-owned bridges, carpoolers must use a designated carpool lane to qualify for the toll discount.

If you pick up your FasTrak transponder by July 15th you will receive \$10 in free tolls

If you order your FasTrak online by July 15th you will receive \$5 in free tolls
